Message from the Library Board Chair Lyn Greenhill

This was a year of many accomplishments and changes at Richmond Public Library. The children's Summer Reading Club had an unprecedented 4,900 kids reading for pleasure during the summer; nearly 3,000 people attended the Chinese New Year Celebrations this year; over 2,000 people enjoyed the Celebrate Canada Fair; and close to 1,600 people participated in the interactive displays at the Brighouse Science Bash.

In addition to our English language DVD dispenser, customers who enjoy Chinese movies can now borrow popular DVDs from the new Chinese language DVD dispenser that we introduced last fall.

With a recent staff reorganization we now have Customer Service Clerks and library users are getting even better service. To date, the Customer Service Clerks have answered over 12,000 reference questions and other inquiries.

Thanks to funding from Richmond City Council, Hamilton area residents are happy to have weekly library service, conveniently located at the Hamilton Community Centre.

The round Ralphy library card for kids continues to be popular with young library users and nearly 8,000 cards have been issued. We're very proud to announce that the library won the prestigious *John Cotton Dana Library Public Relations Award* as well as the *BC Library Association Merit Award* for the Ralphy Card Campaign; the *Cultural Diversecity Award* for multicultural services and diversity in the workplace; and the *CLA/Information Today Award for Innovative Technology* for our DVD Dispenser. We look forward in the coming months to more successes and improvements in services and collections.

Celebrate Canada Fair

Over 2,000 children and adults participated in the Celebrate Canada Fair, which offered recent immigrants and families a fun way to learn about Canada's history, culture, art, sports, industries and recreation.



Brighouse Science Bash

In celebration of National Science and Technology Week, RPL teamed up with various science departments in the federal and provincial governments to hold a Science Bash. More than 1,600 students enjoyed interactive and educational activities that taught them about the different fields of science and the scientific research that the government is doing. Ten booths were set up with all sorts of scientific experiments and models, and kids learned how to track animals with radar, identify rocks, and make a DNA model.



Chinese DVD Dispenser

Thousands of families and individuals can enjoy popular and bestselling movies in Chinese, now that the library has a new Chinese DVD Dispenser. This technology houses and manages a high demand collection of over 1,000 DVDs and makes it easy for customers to borrow and return movies.



Customer Service Clerks

The introduction of customer service clerks ensures that library users find what they need, when and where they need it. A new Ask Me station prominently located on the main floor allows customers to identify staff more easily.

Partners in Literacy

Since its inception in 2006, the Richmond E-Venti Marathon, organized by JJ Hill, Michelle LaPorte, Linda Hilts and Starbucks, has donated \$21,600 to the library in support of children's literacy in our community. Partnerships like this help Richmond Public Library offer great resources to new readers.



Improvement in Branch Hours

With the change in hours at the Steveston, Ironwood, and Cambie branches, customers are thrilled that they can visit the library and borrow material earlier in the day. Holds service for Hamilton customers was introduced in fall 2007 and holds on Cambie material are now available to all.

VIRTUAL LIBRARY SERVICES

RPL improved access to technology by adding two new electronic databases, Learning Express and Press Display, which can be used in the library or from home.

- Learning Express provides interactive online learning for students and adult learners who want to take practice tests and tutorial courses in order to pass academic or licensing tests. Users get immediate scoring, complete answer explanation and an individualized analysis of their results.
- ▶ Press Display allows customers online access to over 500 newspapers from around the world.
